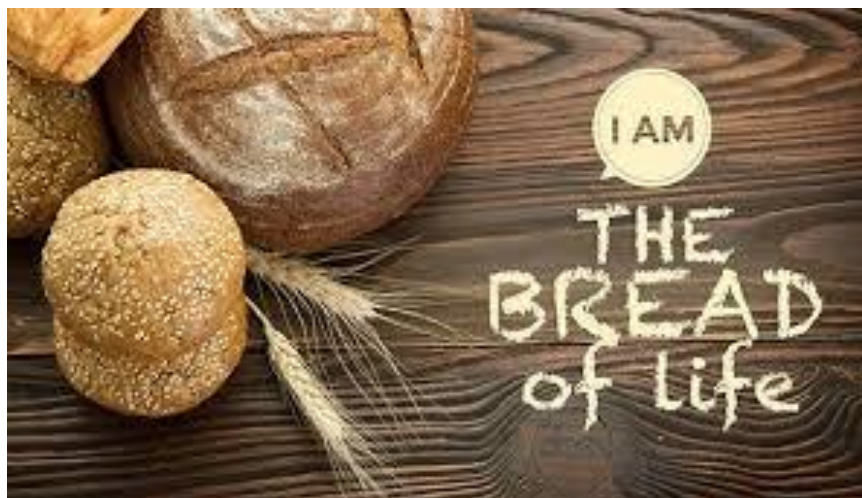

The Proclamation of the Word

Prayer for Illumination

Presider: God of wisdom, as we listen to the scriptures read and interpreted, send us your Spirit so that we may hear your Word with new understanding. Move within us so that we respond in faithfulness for the sake of Christ, our Living Lord. **Amen.**

First Reading: Exodus 16: 1–8 David Rudd

Reader: The first reading is taken from the sixteenth chapter of the Book of Exodus, beginning at the first verse.

16 The whole congregation of the Israelites set out from Elim; and Israel came to the wilderness of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had departed from the land of Egypt. ² The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. ³ The Israelites said to them, “If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger.

⁴ Then the LORD said to Moses, “I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. ⁵ On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.” ⁶ So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, “In the evening you shall know that it was the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, ⁷ and in the morning you shall see the glory of the LORD, because he has heard your complaining against the LORD. For what are we, that you complain against us?” ⁸ And Moses said, “When the LORD gives you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the LORD has heard the complaining that you utter against him—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the LORD.”

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

Use us in every opportunity that presents itself to serve you by serving our neighbours near and far.
And so we pray together the words you yourself taught us:

All: who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

According to Luke, when our risen Lord was at table with his disciples, he took the bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him. This is the Lord's Table. Our Saviour invites all those who trust him to share the feast which he has prepared. O taste and see that the Lord is good.

The Celebration of the Eucharist

The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving 1

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise,
Lord God, Creator of heaven and earth.

From the days when you called Moses and Miriam to lead your people, your love has brought freedom in the face of oppression, and guidance through the wilderness of trials and temptations.

When your people turned from your ways,
you called us back to you through your prophets. In Christ Jesus, you came to live among us, to show us how to follow your truth and find our joy complete in you. Therefore

All: we join with the whole creation to lift our hearts in joyful praise:

Celebrant: God of majesty and mercy, blessed is your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Sent to be our Saviour, he delivered us from sin and death, bringing us abundant life through his courage and compassion. Dying on the cross, he gave up his life so that we might live. By raising him to new life, you promise us life everlasting. Ascended to your right hand, he spreads his mercy throughout your whole creation. We thank you that on the night before he died, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread and said "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood. Do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus

Christ, we take this bread and this cup and give you praise and thanksgiving.

All: **Dying, you destroyed our death.**
 Rising, you restored our life.
 Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Celebrant: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us,
 and upon this bread and wine, that we, and all who share this
 feast, may be one with Christ and he with us. Here we offer
 ourselves to be a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to you. In
 your mercy, accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Fill us
 with the joy of eternal life, that we may be your faithful people
 until we feast with you in glory. Through Christ, with Christ, in
 Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour are
 yours, Almighty God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant: Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for
 we all partake of the one bread. (1 Cor. 10: 17)

When we break the bread, it is a sharing in the body of Christ.

When we bless the cup, it is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

Communion: *All who know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour are welcome
 to receive Communion. It will be administered to you, as you
 remain seated— first the bread, which we will all consume
 together after it has been distributed, then the cups, which we will
 also drink together.*
